

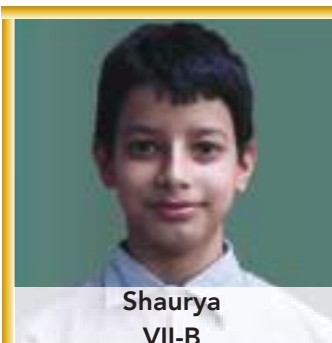

The Marian family expressed gratitude to His Grace for being a loving shepherd to them at all times.

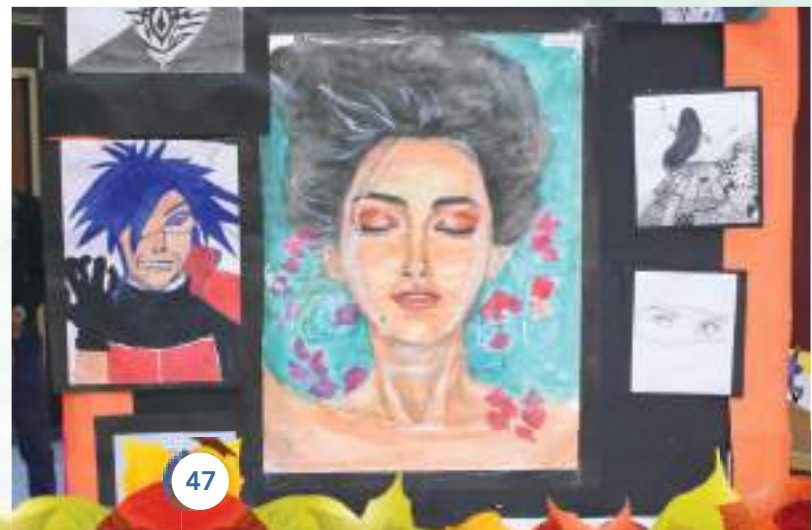


SYNERGY -THE ART EXHIBITION

CBSE ACTIVITIES 2022-23

CBSE, as part of the celebration of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, organized many activities throughout the year on different topics to bring out different visions of students on India. The theme for the student-enrichment activities conducted by the Board for the academic session 2022-23 was- Vision for India @2047. Our students actively and enthusiastically participated in all activities covering wide topics like tourism in India, water conservation, follow traffic rules etc.



INCLUSIVE EDUCATION IN SCHOOL

Special education refers to a range of educational and social services provided by the public school system and other educational institutions to individuals with disabilities and who are between three to twenty one years of age.

Children with learning disabilities also tend to be more empathetic due to the hardships they face. In our school, special education plays an essential role. It helps those children whose learning is impacted by physical, cognitive, behavioural or emotional conditions. Every child has the right to education and opportunities. In our Institution, we provide special education and counselling to help Children With Special Needs (CWSN). We provide necessary support to the children and do the required modifications as per their need.

Our school is working on the Individual Educational Programme (IEP) goals. These are specially planned according to the need and level of the CWSN and that helps to achieve their scholastic and co scholastic needs and make them confident and developed to be a part of the mainstream society.



GLIMPSES OF THE ORIENTATIONS

An orientation programme was conducted in our school on 1 and 2 April 2022 by Rev. Fr. John Ravi SJ, the Secretary of Jesuit Educational association in South Asia. The one-day programme focused on Education for Human Excellence. The orientation was divided into three sessions. Rev. Fr. Ravi emphasised on the need for 'a guide by the side' philosophy for a better living. He said that Faith, Depth, Reconciliation and the Will to become Global Citizens will help man lead a good and meaningful life. During the programme, inspirational videos were shown. In the concluding session, Rev. Father discussed various techniques to destress ourselves. The orientation was very informative and interactive.

CAREER COUNSELLING SESSION-An educationist and social entrepreneur, Ms. Reena Charles was invited to give career counselling to the students of Class X on 15 November 2022. Ms. Reena Charles is a sought after public speaker who conducts parenting seminars as well as motivational workshops for students.

Students were guided to keep their goals clear and SMART- Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time Bound. They were given tips to choose their career wisely, based on their interest, personality and aptitude. They were encouraged to discover their core values which must be aligned with their career. It was an interactive and enriching session.



JUSTICE, PEACE AND INTEGRITY OF CREATION (JPIC) CLUB

St. Mary's conducts many activities, both online and offline, to instil and keep alive the Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation (JPIC) values among the students. This year too many activities were conducted to live up to the JPIC vision. Here is a glimpse of the activities conducted.

In August- September, JPIC members made some thought-provoking posters highlighting the problems concerning the various kinds of pollutions in the vicinity- dust, air, water and soil.

To observe our independence, in the next activity for the month of August, students wrote a paragraph where they connected patriotism to the JPIC goals of peace, integrity and justice.

In October, 'The Seasons of Creation' week was observed. In the morning assembly, the wounds caused to Mother Earth were discussed and ways to improve the environment were expressed. 'The Burning Bush Activity' was a beautiful display of our commitment to the environment. Candles were lit and pledges were written. A glass jar activity was done for all the classes. International Day for Peace and Non-Violence was also observed through an assembly.

In November, an assembly depicting the contemporary problems of women was shown and the importance of 'ORANGE THE WORLD Campaign- End Violence Against Women and Girls' was expressed.

In December, an outreach programme to the needy was planned. Every year, items of daily use and good clothes are contributed by our organization. A children's parliament, including all JPIC club members and also members from other clubs, came together to pay a visit and spread the Christmas message.

In January, a few activities and a special assembly commemorating Mother Mary Ward's life was conducted. JPIC students also reminded the young Marians about the National Girl Child Day.

Our Club members also came up with a badge with the JPIC and the School logo. This will be worn by all Club members, to be known and to act as earth warriors.

Teachers and students are all ready to put in their best to adopt JPIC as a way of life and also inspire others to do the same.



LEADERSHIP TRAINING SERVICE (LTS) CLUB

Leadership Training Service (LTS) Club is an inevitable part of any educational institution's curriculum. Our school is one such school that understands the importance of developing leadership qualities in its students. As a part of leadership training service, the Club conducted several activities which aimed at stimulating leadership skills among students. Various activities like community outreach programme, waste management, discussion on case studies on life values were held throughout the academic year.

CLUBS OF OUR SCHOOL

The community outreach programme was conducted with the objective of instilling a sense of social responsibility and empathy among the students. The programme was held in a nearby slum, where the students got the opportunity to closely observe the lives of the residents. Another community outreach programme was held at Mother Teresa Home, Asha Sadan, where the students interacted with the inmates. The students were divided into groups and given specific tasks to perform, such as organizing games and activities for the inmates. Both the programmes allowed the students to learn about the realities of life outside their privileged existence. The waste management activity was conducted with the aim of creating awareness about the importance of waste management and environment sustainability. The students were educated on the various types of wastes and the appropriate ways of disposing them. The activity was successful in creating awareness among students about the need to reduce waste and adopt eco-friendly practices. As a part of the activity, the students were asked to clean their classrooms and the school premises.



A case study discussion on life values was conducted with the aim of instilling the values of empathy, compassion and integrity among students. The students were given case studies of real-life situations and were asked to discuss and analyze them from a moral and ethical perspective.

Every activity helped to develop critical thinking and decision-making skills among the students. All the activities were successful in achieving the objectives of the LTS Club and helped the students to instil a sense of social

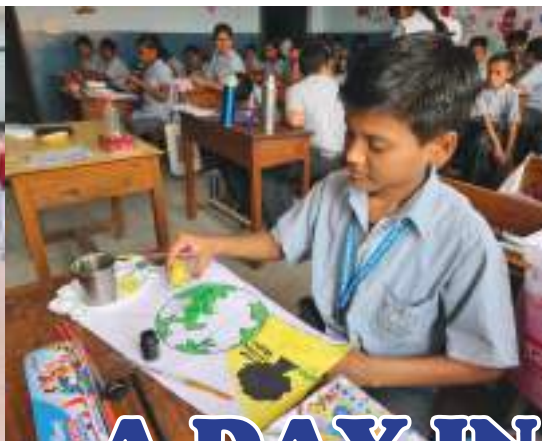
THE MARIAN TALK SHOW

‘सत्संगति’ शब्द दो शब्दों से मिलकर बना है – सत् संगति। ‘सत्’ का मतलब ‘सज्जन’ एवं ‘संगति’ का मतलब ‘साथ’ अर्थात् सत्संगति का अर्थ सज्जनों के साथ से है।

कदली, सीप, भुजंग मुख, स्वाति एक गुण तीन।
जैसी संगति बैठिए, तैसोहि फल दीन्ह ॥

अर्थात् स्वाति नक्षत्र में वर्षा के जल की एक बूँद यदि कदली (केले) में गिरती है तो कपूर बन जाती है, यदि सीप में गिरती है तो मोती बन जाती है और यदि वही बूँद भुजंग (साँप) के मुख में गिर जाए तो विष (जहर) बन जाती है। जिस प्रकार पारस के स्पर्श से लोहा भी सोना बन जाता है ठीक वैसे ही सत्संगति के प्रभाव से साधारण व्यक्ति भी श्रेष्ठ बन जाता है तथा उसके महान बनने का मार्ग भी प्रशस्त हो जाता है। संगति का प्रभाव व्यक्ति के व्यक्तित्व को बहुत प्रभावित करता है। अच्छे मनुष्यों की संगति उन्नति की ओर अग्रसर करती है और बुरे मनुष्यों की संगति पतन के गर्त में ढकेल देती है। कहा भी जाता है – ‘काजल की कोठरी में कितना भी बुद्धिमान मनुष्य क्यों न जाए, उस पर काजल का कोई न कोई चिह्न अवश्य अंकित हो जाता है।’


